### 1. PROLONGED: Call for Nominations: Danubius Young Scientist Award 2019

Due to the large number of last-minute applications and requests we are receiving, the Call for Nominations for the **Danubius Young Scientist Award 2019** has been **PROLONGED until 31st May 2019**!



The Danubius Young Scientist Award will be granted to 14 young scientists - one in each country that is part of the EUSDR. The award seeks to encourage young scientists to engage in the scientific examination of problems and questions specifically related to the Danube and to stimulate the scientific community in the Danube region. The award will be endowed with 1.200,- Euros for each winner of the Danubius Young Scientist Award. Moreover, thanks to the ongoing kind support by the JRC, the awardees will be invited by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre to visit the JRC in Ispra, Italy in 2020.

The candidate has to be nominated by his/her hosting scientific organisation (university, academy of sciences, etc.) meaning that the candidate himself/herself cannot apply for the award.

Every university, academy of sciences or research organization etc. can nominate up to a maximum of three candidates in total; however the three candidates have to come from different faculties or departments, institutes or research groups within the organization.

Rectors' Conference) that will be responsible for assessing all incoming nominations and for drawing up a final ranking. The most highly ranked candidate from each of the countries of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region will be recommended for the award.

### The award ceremony is expected to take place in Bucharest in November 2019.

- Nominations will be accepted in electronic format and in English only.
- Nominations including all relevant documents have to be sent to: d.martinek@idm.at
- The deadline for submitting nominations is on 31st May 2019 at 23:59.

The Danubius Award was created in 2011 by the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM) and the Austrian Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Research (BMBWF) to honor persons with extraordinary scientific achievements and output in relation to the Danube Region. Within a rotation system in one year achievements in the fields of humanities, social and cultural studies are awarded, in the following year achievements in the fields of life sciences.

2019 it is envisaged to complement this award for the sixth time with a specific price for young scientists – the so-called "Danubius Young Scientist Award".


After the end of the Summer School your contribution will be officially published as an article in the scientific journal "Der Donauraum".

### 4. Online consultation on the revision of the EUSDR Action Plan



The <u>EU Strategy For The Danube Region</u> (EUSDR) is a <u>Macro-Regional</u> <u>Strategy</u> adopted by the European Commission, which covers 14 countries, stretches from the Black Forest (Germany) to the Black Sea (Romania-Bulgaria-Moldova-Ukraine) and is home to 115 million inhabitants.

### Context and aim of the consultation

Romanian EUSDR Presidency and Danbe Strategy Point (DSP) launched today an online consultation through EUSDR platforms for better involving civil society representatives and general public in process of updating the actions and projects of strategic impact for the Danube Region included in the EUSDR Action Plan from December 2010.

In preparing the new programming period for cohesion 2020+ the EU Strategy For The Danube Region is revising its Action Plan. All actors of EUSDR, National Coordinators, Priority Coordinators and Steering Groups, Stakeholders and experts from our countries and the European Commission Services are currently involved in drafting their inputs for the new Action Plan of the Danube Strategy.

Until end of May 2019 the first draft proposal of the new Action Plan will be finished. In June 2019 at the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Forum of EUSDR in Bucharest, the Romanian

consolidated inputs by all actors of the Strategy, the European Commission will use the consolidated proposal to draft the New Action Plan which prospectively will be endorsed by the Ministers of the Danube Region in October 2019.

As the Strategy is a bottom-up process, Civil Society of the Danube Macro Region has the opportunity to bring in their proposals for the new Action Plan. Therefore, everybody who would like to participate in the revision process is invited to present in his/her ideas for new strategic projects and actions as a valuable input for the Strategy.

### Target group of the public consultation

The target group of this consultation are interested individuals and Civil society organisations / representatives. Please also feel free to add other relevant topics or suggest improved approaches.

Your contributions will be most useful to us in developing an updated Action Plan of the EU Macro-Regional Strategy which addresses the main priorities of the Danube Region.

This questionnaire can be filled in **before the 20<sup>th</sup> May 2019**. Please add your email address in order to offer the opportunity for inviting you to the **Public Hearing** which will take place on **27<sup>th</sup> June 2019 in Bucharest** and inform you about the results of the consultations.

### 7. proESOF Call for Proposals



This call for proposals, launched by the <u>TESI Local Programme Committee</u>, aims to collect ideas and to support the development of initiatives which will enhance dissemination, education, networking and training from now until ESOF 2020. In particular the call collects and evaluates three distinct groups of initiatives:

- **proESOF events 2018-2020** preferentially in the North-East of Italy and Central and Eastern European areas;
- Science in the City Festival, Trieste ESOF 2020 (three weeks from June 27 to July 18, 2020)
- Draft proposals for the official call of ESOF 2020 Trieste (Call in January 2019).

The proposals may be related to the following areas:

**Science to Science**: focused on current and future path-breaking science, it provides for keynote speeches and events, plenary sessions, workshops, rountables and debates. It encompasses social sciences and humanities as well as physical and life sciences, engineering and medicine.

**Science to Business**: a unique platform in Europe to exchange ideas and good practices on research-driven business models, public private partnerships, the

**Science to Policy**: stakeholders, governments, scientists, industry and the public in the Triveneto region and in the South East European countries, will be asked to cooperate in a joint effort to ensure reliable, evidence-based policy-making for the benefit of the society as a whole. Possible discussion subjects include the ethical use of scientific knowledge in addressing the grand challenges of humankind, integrity of science, science diplomacy to build peace and cohesion.

**Science to Citizens**: it aims to create a scientific citizenship for all and to promote the idea of science as fundamental to problem-solving. All activities and events organized in this frame will inspire passion and a collaborative attitude in people, from the very young to the elderly, in order to build a sense of identity and ownership within the field of science.

**Science to Communicators**: aimed at building a solid network of science communicators active in different fields (from journalism to events organizing, from publishing to communication corporate) across Europe, with a special focus on the Triveneto region and the South East European countries.

The fourth USAMV Bucharest Agricultural Economics and Policy Summer School will take place at USAMVB from **9th-14th of September 2019**. Because of the high number of applications on this topic in the past, the six-day event will again focus on "Policy Evaluation in Agriculture". The course will start with the normative foundations of policy evaluation, will cover methodological tasks and finally dive into a case study. Students are going to work on the concept for policy evaluation themselves and have the opportunity to participate in numerous excursions that illustrate the everyday business of policy evaluation, but also the wealth of Romanian rural culture.

The target group that the event addresses includes:

- Postgraduate students (Masters or PhD students) in the field of agricultural economics and policy
- Young researchers with an educational background in economics, management, marketing or other social sciences disciplines applied to agriculture
- Young professionals from governmental institutions (ministries, authorities and agencies), non-governmental organizations related to agriculture who need a refresher course.

The Joint Research Centre of the European Commission has opened a Call to access JRC Research Infrastructures for Training and Capacity Building for Enlargement and Integration Countries to the:

The call is addressed to JRC external users from universities, research or public institutions, or from Small-Medium-Enterprises (SME).

Training is free of charges and travel/subsistence costs are covered by the JRC.

### Conditions and criteria for access

The JRC offers access to its **non-nuclear facilities** to researchers from Lead User Institution and User Institutions (see definitions in the Framework) only from countries associated to the EU Research Programme Horizon 2020. The Lead User Institution must be from a university, research or public institution, or from a Small-Medium-Enterprise (SME).

 Nanomaterials sizing using dynamic light scattering, disk centrifuge sedimentation, asymmetric and sedimentation field flow fractionation with different detectors and analytical ultra-centrifuge.

- In vitro assays for studying nanomaterial-cell interactions and highlighting pitfalls occurring during assay development due to the specific nature of nanomaterial (in vitro dosimetry, interaction of nanomaterial with cell reagents).
- Biomolecular interaction studies using surface plasmon resonance and quartz microbalance techniques.
- Raman spectroscopy, ellipsometry, electron microscopy and an introduction to surface chemistry analysis using XPS and/or ToF-SIMS.
- o ICP-MS including single particle detection.


