The 12th edition of the Summer School has the main topic: "Recent political changes and their implications in the Danube Region"

Applications for participation may be handed in by e-mail or fax until June 7, 2015 and should include the application form, the CV of the applicant and an abstract max. 2 pages of the paper that shall be presented in the framework of the Summer School.

The registration fee of the Summer School is EUR 200.-, the contribution to the expenses for board and accommodation is EUR 230.-

Please note that it is possible to apply for a scholarship on board and accommodation as well as on a partial travel reimbursement (limited to EUR 100.-).

There is a possibility to register as an 'Early bird', if the paper and application form is submitted before April 5, 2015, the registration fee is reduced to EUR 100.-.

The participants are selected by a jury taking into account the guidance of the presidency of the Danube Rectors' Conference (DRC).

The successful participation of the DRC Summer School will be granted with 10 ECTS points by the University of Pécs, Faculty of Humanities.

5. PRESENTATION OF DRC MEMBER UNIVERSITIES - UASVM Bucharest

The UASVM-Bucharest is a Life Science University, established in 1852 as The Agricultural Institute of Pantelimon. Only two years later, The School for Veterinary Education was

founded.In 1867, after including forestry subject matters in the curriculum, agronomic education develops under the name of The Central Agricultural and Forestry School. Within it, the first didactic and experimental farm in the country was established and in 1868 the first agricultural research institution in Romania was created, known as the Bucharest Agronomic Station. In time, the School passed through many changes and in 1948 became the Bucharest Agronomic Institute, with four faculties (Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Sciences and Veterinary Medicine). Since then, three new faculties were founded: Faculty of Land Reclamation and Environmental Engineering (1970), Faculty of Biotechnologies (1994) and Faculty of Management, Economic Engineering in Agriculture and Rural Development (2000). In 1995, the institute became the University of Agronomic Sciences and Veterinary Medicine of Bucharest, being the oldest and largest agricultural institution of higher education in Romania. From 2000, the University is a member of the Romanian Consortia of Life Science Universities alongside its sister universities from Cluj, Iasi and Timisoara.
