15th Danube Rectors' Conference Summer School on Regional Cooperation "Modernizing Europe: Generating Accountability"

This year's DRC Summer School was held in **Krems, Austria**, from July 1st to July 8th 2018. This edition was opened with the presence of **Friedrich Faulhammer**, Rector of the Danube University Krems and DRC president, **Sebastian Schäffer**, Secretary General of DRC and research associate at Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe and **Ulrike Guérot**, Professor for European Policy and the Study of Democracy. She shared her insights on "Why Europe must become a Republic" giving rise to a fruitful discussion with all of the participants.

We were also honored by the presence of various experts from different fields such as political sciences, economics, foreign policies and history. Having this wide spectrum of approaches allowed the participants to deepen their knowledge on the current issues regarding regional cooperation within the Danube Region.

After all of the lectures our participants took part in a workshop session where they developed two potential future scenarios for the Danube Region. One group proposed a pessimistic scenario, while the other came up with an optimistic one. Both of them were later presented to **Rudolf Schicker**, Coordinator of the Priority Area 10 of the EUSDR, during the discussion at IDM in Vienna.

8. Call for Papers - Climate Change adaptation in the Danube Region

results of finalized or ongoing research projects and best practices within the Danube basin on the field of climate change adaptation. Therefore PA5 area will finance in 2018 a Thematic Issue of the Journal of Environmental Geography (JoEG) in cooperation with the University of Szeged.

<u>JoEG is a peer-reviewed open access online journal</u> with a distinguished international Editorial Board. JoEG is published twice a year and covered by several abstracting and indexing services e.g. Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), EBSCO, GeoRef, and Google Scholar and published on De Gruyter's online platform.

JoEG provides

- double-blind peer review
- rapid publication
- NO publishing costs and article processing fees
- FREE open access for readers
- larger audience and more citations due to the increasing number of abstracting and indexing services

The thematic issue aims to encompass articles from different fields, analysing among others the vulnerability of water bodies, soil mass, different ecosystems and the human environment of the region to climate change impacts and helps to identify potential adaptation measures. The issue will facilitate to raise awareness and gather stakeholders to share knowledge and focus on the better preparedness and resilience of the Danube countries against the adverse effects of climate change. It also gives a great opportunity to trace the Danube basin research progress in order to stimulate further investigation topics.

Academic research papers have to be written in good English (both American and British usage are accepted).

Purpose of the workshop and proposed content

- To provide policy makers and innovation practitioners with knowledge and training/practical insights in setting up successful start-up platforms with support programmes strengthening regional/national innovation ecosystems.
- · To review various models of acceleration, building a pipeline of projects, attracting industrial partners, providing business support services, involving governmental entities, which are key elements in the development of successful innovation ecosystems.

The workshop will target in particular policy makers and other innovation stakeholders such as universities, research organisations, chambers of commerce, business angels, science parks and other relevant practitioners from South-East Europe.

- What support services are needed and how best to deliver them?
- Why is it important to create an ecosystem supporting start-ups?
- How to build a successful start-ups ecosystem?
- How to build an adequate pipeline of projects and a deal flow?
- Whom to involve: actors and stakeholders (quadruple helix)?
