



5. Danubius Awards

with the Danubius Awards. The Danubius Awards were created in 2011 by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research (BMBWF) and the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM). The price is divided into three categories: the Danubius Award, the Danubius Mid-Career Award and the Danubius Young Scientist Award.

The winner of the Danubius Award 2018 is Hungarian political scientist **Professor Béla Greskovits** for his outstanding scientific achievements in the field of humanities, cultural and social sciences. Professor Greskovits deals with the issues of economic and democratic transformation in Eastern Europe and is considered an expert in the field of political economics of Eastern and Central Europe.

The Danubius Mid-Career Award 2018, which was awarded for the first time, went to **Dr. Ana Hofman** for her scientific work on the musical-cultural heritage of post-Yugoslavia in the field of ethnicity and gender identity.

The Danubius Young Scientist Award was granted to 12 young scientists for their talent and scientific work related with issues and questions regarding the Danube Region.

6. JRC interactive software tool Story Map

For the 7th EUSDR Annual Forum in Sofia, JRC prepared an interactive software tool **Story Map** on tourism in the Danube region.

EU-funded projects on tourism, cultural heritage and arts, bike routes and wellness resorts are among the highlights of an interactive Story Map on tourism in the Danube region (<u>http://arcg.is/b49eC</u>), launched by the JRC at the 7th Annual Forum of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region (EUSDR) on 18th October 2018 in Sofia.

It is an innovative way of displaying various datasets linked to various policy issues in an accessible and attractive way. It takes the viewer on a journey along the Danube river and the countries it borders and flows through.

The Story Map gives a snapshot of the rich heritage of the Danube region and the potential of its tourism economy. It also allows users to learn about the cultural heritage initiatives supported by the EU in the region and the links between cultural and natural heritage.

As said by Commissioner Tibor Navracsics in his speech, the Story Map "*showcases* our beautiful Danube region and also gives an overview of some of the main challenges facing it."

7. proESOF Call for Proposals

This call for proposals, launched by the <u>TESI Local Programme Committee</u>, aims to collect ideas and to support the development of initiatives which will enhance dissemination, education, networking and training from now until ESOF 2020. In particular the call collects and evaluates three distinct groups of initiatives:

 proESOF events 2018-2020 preferentially in the North-East of Italy and Central and Eastern European areas; • Draft proposals for the official call of ESOF 2020 Trieste (Call in January 2019).

The proposals may be related to the following areas:

Science to Science: focused on current and future path-breaking science, it provides for keynote speeches and events, plenary sessions, workshops, rountables and debates. It encompasses social sciences and humanities as well as physical and life sciences, engineering and medicine.

Science to Business: a unique platform in Europe to exchange ideas and good practices on research-driven business models, public private partnerships, the economic developments resulting from technological innovation, future careers and future "new jobs" opportunities.

Science to Policy: stakeholders, governments, scientists, industry and the public in the Triveneto region and in the South East European countries, will be asked to cooperate in a joint effort to ensure reliable, evidence-based policy-making for the benefit of the society as a whole. Possible discussion subjects include the ethical use of scientific knowledge in addressing the grand challenges of humankind, integrity of science, science diplomacy to build peace and cohesion.

Science to Citizens: it aims to create a scientific citizenship for all and to promote the idea of science as fundamental to problem-solving. All activities and events organized in this frame will inspire passion and a collaborative attitude in people, from the very young to the elderly, in order to build a sense of identity and ownership within the field of science.

Science to Communicators: aimed at building a solid network of science communicators active in different fields (from journalism to events organizing, from publishing to communication corporate) across Europe, with a special focus on the Triveneto region and the South East European countries.


EUA is accepting proposals for presentations and interactive workshop sessions. The deadline is 8 January 2019.


