2. The DRC Scholarship winners share their impressions



At the **beginning of September** the winners of the **DRC scholarships** chosen among the participants of the <u>OeAD</u>'s summer school projects, the <u>Green Building Solution</u> and the <u>Alternative Economic and Monetary Sustems</u>, were selected and announced. After the proclamation the four were interviewed by the <u>IDM</u> about some of the most important points of their experince with the projects.

Berina Brčaninović is a 24-year-old Bosnian student on the faculty of Architecture of University of Sarajevo. The group workes and lectures gave her the opportunity to connect with people from all over the world and to apply her knowledge on the

project she and her collegues have created at the end. This experince pushed her to apply for a Master's degree in sustainable architecture.

Semina Hadžić is a 22-year-old university student, currently enrolled at University of Sarajevo, where she is graduating in Architecture and Urbanism. In her words this Summer University helped her to gain a set of skills needed for a young architect and she would try to implement the acquired knowledge in her own projects.

Emina Hasanović is a 29-year-old Bosnian undergraduate enrolled on the faculty of Architecture and Urbanism of the UNiversity of Sarajevo. She was pleased to meet people with her same goal: to reduce the effects of climate change and to create a better environment.

Fabio Ashtar Telarico is a 22-year-old Italian junior expert who is doing a Joint Master's Programme in Southeast European Studies, University of Graz and University of Belgrade. He stated that it has provided him with a number of experiences and occasions to improve real-life and problem-solving skills.

3. The OeAD Summer Universities 2021



This year the <u>OeAD</u> hosted two unique online summer schools. The <u>Green Building Solution Summer School</u>, the online classes lasted from **July 17 to August 8, 2021**, and the <u>Alternative Economic and Monetary Systems Summer School</u>, lasted from **July 19, 2021 to August 6, 2021**.

The aim of the former was to teach and indeep the ecological knowledge and

engineering expertise in a condense three-week program. On the other hand, the latter focused on **restructuring economic systems** to achieve a sustainable use of resources and a more collaborative society overall.

The students had an opportunity to learn about sustainable buildings in an intercultural environment from trained experts with very vast and variegated backgrounds who shared with them the newest developments on the field. Both programs offered the respectively **7 and 5 ECTS certificates** after their completion.

We will keep you informed about the results of the projects developed during the programs once they will be published by the OeAD.

Next year, there will be **another edition of both summer schools** and we will make you know about all the deadlines for the applications as soon as we know them, so keep in touch with our **Newsletter** to be sure to not miss anything about it.

This <u>initiative</u> of the <u>the EU Strategy for the Danube Region</u> (EUSDR) aims to bridge potential applicants from the Danube Region in upcoming Horizon Europe "Widening" calls in order to foster participation in this programme.

The Horizon Europe Info day on **28 October 2021** will focus on the Horizon Europe part for "*Widening participation and spreading excellence*".

At the Info day on 28 October 2021 the main conditions of the addressed Horizon

Europe "Widening" calls with a special concentration on the various novelties, new possibilities and actions will be presented by a representative of the European Commission.

In addition, some of the so far successfully implemented "Widening" projects in previous EU framework programmes will be presented. Enough time will be dedicated to Q&As, so that as many issues as possible could be clarified. The Info day will be supplemented by the possibility of continuous (long-term) virtual matchmakings (B2B) meetings lasting until 15 March 2022 (the end of the last submission deadline of the targeted Horizon Europe "Widening" calls).

The bilateral virtual matchmaking (B2B) meetings provide prospective applicants or researchers an opportunity to meet and discuss ideas for joint projects and to build consortia.

5. The Stanisław Lem European Research Prize (Lem Prize)




The competition is open to young scientists up to 40 years old, associated with a university or research institution in an EU or Horizon-associated country and in Switzerland.

<u>Lem Prize</u> is awarded for a recent scientific achievement made **within last 3 years** in **field of science and engineering**. The competition application along with the

required documents must be submitted electronically by **October 15, 2021**. The winner will be announced on **November 15, 2021**, during the celebrations of **Wroclaw Tech University**'s anniversary.

6. The Open Access call of the ELSA and the nano-biotechnology laboratory



The Open Access call of the ELSA and the Nano biotechnology Laboratory Joint Call between two JRC Research Infrastructures to tackle cross-boundary issues with the access cost waived for institutions applying from WPSE-listed countries. We invite proposals for projects to experiment, prototype and demonstrate ideas for the New European Bauhaus.

The ELSA Reaction Wall and the Nanobiotechnology Laboratory will serve as collaboration platform to stimulate creativity and innovation in the built environment. Location: Ispra, Italy. Opening of the call will be on September 22, the closure one on January 16.

Research priorities:

- Safe and green renovation of buildings for the New European Bauhaus.
- New materials and technologies.
- Sustainable materials for construction.
- Application of advanced testing methods.

7. Developing a high-performance digital education ecosystem Workshop (EUA)



On behalf of the <u>DIGI-HE project</u> consortium, the <u>European University Association</u> is pleased to announce that registrations are now open for the online workshop "<u>Developing a high-performance digital education ecosystem: strategy and organisational culture</u>," taking place on **19 October 2021 at 14.00-17.00** (CET).

The workshop aims at supporting institutions in the assessment of their achievements and opportunities in **digitally enhanced learning and teaching**. Free of charge and **open to all EUA members**, it will be of interest to higher education leaders responsible for learning and teaching and its digital transformation.

Registrations for this workshop are **open until 5 October**. Early registration is advised as attendance is **limited to 30 participants** with a maximum of two representatives per institution.

The "ICA Regional Network for Central and South Eastern Europe" (CASEE) is a network of Central and South Eastern European Higher Education Institutions linking Life Science disciplines in the region ranging from natural resources, environment, food, agriculture, biotechnology and natural resources.
