We are thrilled to announce the 2021 Danube Conference: **Shrinking Spaces – Growing Responsibilities: Macro-regional approaches to tackle current transformations in the Danube Region**, taking place on 10th November via Livestream on [IDM Facebook page](#).

A decade ago, the **EU Strategy for the Danube Region** was launched, involving different regional actors to join their efforts to tackle *common ecological, transport and socio-economic challenges*. The Covid-19 Pandemic accelerated the urgency to take cooperation a step further, as it clearly emphasized the need to preserve democratic spaces by means of dialogue, partnerships and concerted action at the regional level.

This implies to reflect on the lessons of a decade of macro-regional cooperation, the cross-regional approaches to the recovery from the pandemic and the role they will play in driving the green transition.

These topics, and many other, will be the object of our upcoming **Danube Conference 2021**, taking place **10 years since the EURSDR**. On such a special occasion, we cordially invite you to join our debate on the future of macro-regional cooperation. Discuss with experts and practitioners the growing

4. The Stanisław Lem European Research Prize (Lem Prize)

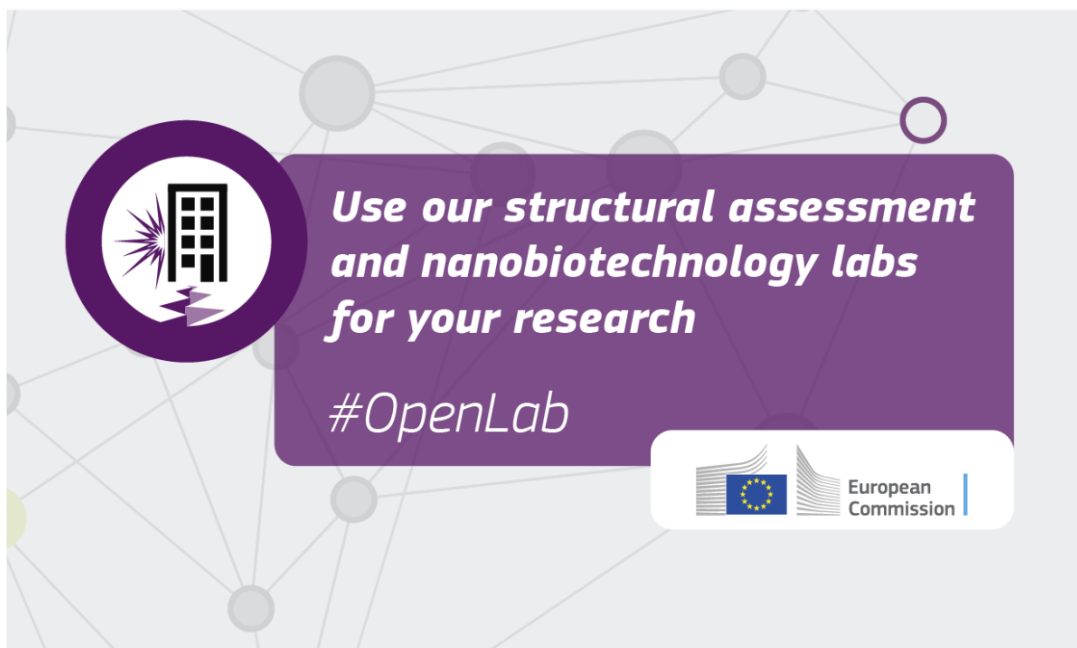


The competition is open to **young scientists up to 40 years old**, associated with a **university or research institution in an EU or Horizon-associated country** and in **Switzerland**.

Lem Prize is awarded for a recent scientific achievement made **within last 3 years** in **field of science and engineering**. The competition application along with the required documents must be submitted electronically by **October 15, 2021**. The winner will be announced on **November 15, 2021**, during the

celebrations of [Wrocław Tech University](#)'s anniversary.
