Dear subscribers of the DRC Newsletter,


Christmas is coming and the end of the year is slowly approaching!

2. Danubius Awards Ceremony 2021



On November 11, 2021, the IDM, together with the Federal Ministry of the Republic of Austria of Education, Science and Research, awarded excellent scientists, whose talent has flourished in the Danube Region.



The **Danubius Award** went to Austrian scientist Prof. **Josef Glößl** University Professor for Applied Genetics at the <u>Institute of Plant Biotechnology and</u> <u>Cell Biology of Boku</u>. We are honoured to have awarded this important prize to Prof. **Glößl**, who stands out for an exceptional career in physiology, chemistry, plant physiology, and applied genetics - together with his invaluable contribution to the Danube region's academic development.

The **Danubius Mid-Career Award** has been awarded to the Serbian scientist **Tanja Dabović**, Ass. Professor at the <u>Faculty of Geography of the University of Belgrade</u>, where she has been working in the field of Spatial Planning since her PhD. Her work has mainly focused on planning disciplines, with particular emphasis on multi-level governance and cross-sector integration. Involved in different national and international projects, Prof. Dabović's research has proved to be meaningful for the Danube Region, as the award clearly demonstrates.

- · Needs and wellbeing of student and staff


The deadline for applications is **28 January 2022**, and the results of the call will be announced in mid-February 2022. The full call is available on this <u>link</u>.
