1. DRC Summer School 2022

We are thrilled to invite our network to save the date for the **FIFUDEM Final** Conference "Functioning democracy in the making", taking place on 13th of July 2022 in Vienna!

The Conference will mark the closing of the Jean Monnet project <u>"From Fictional to Functioning Democracy: Developing Concepts and Strategies for an Inclusive and Participatory Europe (FIFUDEM)"</u>. The project is financed by the Erasmus+-Programme and implemented by the Institute for the Danube Region (<u>IDM</u>) in cooperation with the DRC.

After a keynote lecture and the presentation of the FIFUDEM project results, practitioners from the field of civic education, policy advice and capacity buliding will discuss about anger management and actions for the making of functioning democracies. This **Democracy Talk** aims to channel people's frustrations with politics and democratic decision-making processes into constructive proposals for an inclusive and participatory Europe.

My specialisation is international economic relations and my dissertation is about "The impact of international tourism on the socio-economic development of the EU".

I have always had a proactive position in the society and with the beginning of war I understood, that it is my responsibility to stand with my country. 
