1. DRC Summer School 2022



We are more than happy to announce that after a two-year-break due to Covid, we finally brought together young scientists, university studens and early-stage researchers from all over Europe for our annual DRC Summer School.

The <u>17th DRC Summer School</u> on "Shaping Tomorrow's Research: What Future for Academia in the Danube Region?" took place in Vienna from 10th to 16th July 2022.

Unfortunately, due to the senseless and unjustified Russian attack on Ukraine, the Summer School could not, as originally planned, take place at the Uzhhorod National University in Ukraine. However, we were able to include first-hand experiences of Ukrainian students about learning, volunteering, and mobility in the shadow of the war as one of the focus topics in our Summer School. Other issues touched upon during the last week were the role of research in policymaking, knowledge sharing as well as university autonomy and academic freedom. We are particularly honoured to have welcomed <u>Shalini Randeria</u>, President and Rector of the CEU, as our keynote speaker.

Alongside the lectures, the participants attended the FIFUDEM Final Conference, went on a field trip to the picturesque Wachau valley and ended two days with an amazing dinner at the typical Austrian *Heuriger*. Additionally, they connected with the participants of the <u>DRC Strategic Foresight Project</u>.

In light of the very successful previous week, presentations and wonderful

discussions (academic as not academic), we would like to thank our sponsors for their support, all the participants for being a such an amazing group and for their active participation! Furthermore, many thanks to our highly esteemed visiting lecturers for their inputs, and the IDM team for implementing the project! 2. FIFUDEM Final Conference

We are delighted to share that the FIFUDEM Final Conference "Functioning democracy in the making", which took place on 13th of July 2022 at Springer

Palace in Vienna, has been a great success!

The Conference marked the closing of the Jean Monnet Erasmus+ project "From *Fictional to Functioning Democracy: Developing Concepts and Strategies for an Inclusive and Participatory Europe (FIFUDEM)*", which was implemented by the Institute for the Danube Region (IDM) in cooperation with the DRC since 2019.

The conferece kicked off with a fantastic **keynote lecture by Dr. Daniela Ingruber** (University of Continuing Education Krems) on "Democracy Dies in Darkness - does it?". In this context, one quote in particular lingered in our thoughts:

'We have to abandon the paradigm that democracy is a self-maintaining institution. Democracy needs to be nurtured and cared for in order for it to serve its functions for our society as making government inclusive, fair and progressive.'

Next, Sebastian Schäffer (IDM/DRC) presented the FIFUDEM project and the broad range of activities realised within this framework. Amongst others, these activities included:

- "<u>Democracy is (No!) Fiction</u>" (ed. 4/2020) of the IDM scientific journal 'Der Donauraum'
- "Spielregeln der Macht. Rechtsstaatlichkeit im Donauraum", (ed. 2/2020) and "Ausgebrannt? Rettungspläne für die Demokratie", (ed. 2/2021) of the print magazine 'Info Europa'
- <u>7th Young Scholars Forum 2020</u> on Central and South East Europe under the topic of "European narratives in search for common diversity"

The *Democracy Talks* series was another cornerstone of the FIFUDEM project. We are therefore more than happy that we were able to close **FIFUDEM Final Conference** with the vibrant **Democracy Talk #5: Let's talk about anger management!**

Melanie Jaindl (IDM Assistant Editor) welcomed **Daniel Martínek** (DRC Permanent Secretariat), **Dobrena Petrova** (Research & Project Assistant at Sofia Platform) and **Thomas Prorok** (Managing Director of KDZ Centre for Public Administration Research) on the panel. Together, they discussed recent examples of democracy shortcomings in the Danube region, presented their action plan for respectful dialogue, reflected on participatory elements and, furthermore, stressed cross-border cooperation as a new impetus for democracy.

In the end, we had no choice other but to agree with Mr. Prorok that "Cross-border cooperation is not just about creating documents together. Cross-border cooperation means doing things together, gathering experiences and actively share commons."

4. Call for Application: Membership at the Global Young Academy



We would like to raise your attention for the possibility to **apply for the 2023** Membership at the Global Young Academy (GYA). The application process is open until 15 September 2022, 18.00 UTC!

The vision of the GYA is *science for all; science for the future*, and its mission is to give a voice to young scientists and researchers around the world. The **GYA** is an **independent science academy** of 200 outstanding early- to mid-career researchers from six continents who are selected from **across disciplines** based on their **academic excellence and commitment to engage with society**. GYA members serve **five-year terms**, and the GYA presently counts members and alumni from 100 countries. The GYA administrative Office is **publicly funded and hosted at the German National Academy of Sciences Leopoldina**.

Each GYA member is expected to participate in the Annual General Meeting (AGM; the 2023 AGM will be held from 5th to 9th June 2023 in Rwanda) and to actively contribute to one or more of the organisation's programmes. This includes participation, e.g., in policy development, promotion of the National Young Academies, or promoting science and education at the international level.

Do you feel like being a member of this organisation might be something that interests you? **Apply until the 15th of September 2022 for membership!**




Currently, **applications are actively sought from young, independent scholars** who combine the highest level of research excellence with a demonstrated passion for delivering impact.

Especially women and applicants from different minority groups, and from diverse disciplines including the natural, physical and social sciences as well as the arts and humanities and people working in government, industry, and non-governmental sectors are encouraged to apply.


