3. Danubius Awards Ceremony



The Danubius Award was created in 2011 by the Austrian Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Research (BMBWF) and the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM) to honor people with extraordinary achievements who have made a special contribution to the Danube region in their scientific work or in their work.

This Hybrid Award Ceremony is taking place on November 10, 2022 at 16:00 CET.

The prize is divided into two categories

A) The Danubius Mid-Career Award

This prize is awarded to researchers from 5 to a maximum of 15 years after their last formal scientific degree or equivalent scientific experience, whereby years of suspension of the scientific career are taken into account with appropriate proof.

B) The Danubius Award

This award is independent of formal age limits or the number of years since the last formal scientific degree or the respective status in the scientific world – and is awarded exclusively with reference to the overall scientific merits in and around the Danube region.

The Danubius Award is intended to contribute to the better visibility of the Danube region and to the increased perception of its multidisciplinary challenges and potentials; accompanied by the encouragement to deal with it on a scientific level.

4. Hybrid international workshop on Sustainable University Sport Campus



Over the course of two days, on 27th and 28th of September, an International Workshop on Sustainable University Sport Campus (SUSC) was organised in hybrid event mode by three Institutes of the Faculty of Education and Psychology, Eötvös Loránd University: Institute of Sport Science – Szombathely, Institute of Health Promotion and Sport Science, and the Institute of People – Environment Transaction, as well as the Innovation Centre of Eötvös Loránd University.

We are facing immense, complex challenges such as climate change, social

injustice, economic inequality, and insecurity, therefore, **successful sustainability strategies**, **programs**, **and projects initiations** at different levels and areas work toward balanced and ethical solutions that are not only environmentally sound, but also economically viable and socially just.

A **Sustainable University Campus** defines sustainability in an inclusive way, encompassing health, social justice, and secure livelihoods as well as safe environments for students, staff, and locals while collaboratively creating a world where everyone can thrive. It means protecting our social, economic and cultural values for future generations, and caring about the quality of life in a peaceful world.

This concept should offer goal-oriented opportunities for **HE institutions** that run sport study programs and/or provide a vibrant university sport life, to take the lead in re-defining their outdoor and indoor facilities and infrastructures and develop new paradigms for delivery and support. This can be done by creating smart solutions and sustainable services to meet environmental, social, and economic needs of students, staff, and the local population.

Some **goals** of this workshop were defining the criteria of sustainable operation for university sport campuses and services, discussing ideas and sharing best practices, introducing innovative technologies and methods, creating a network of universities that will collaborate and exchange best practice experiences rated to sustainable university campuses and activities.

5. Second call to the international conference on Good practices and potentials in educational inclusion and desegregation



With the support of other EU-funded projects, Inclusion4Schools is organizing an international conference to bring together researchers, practitioners, journalists and policy-makers to discuss the opportunities and challenges of education to reverse inequalities, to interpret existing narratives, national competences and European initiatives to present good practices resulting from the ongoing projects, and to inform political decision-making processes.
