# 1. Committed to the Danube Region - Introduction of the new DRC President Rector Friedrich Faulhammer



We bring you a few introductory words about the new DRC President Rector Friedrich Faulhammer.

Friedrich Faulhammer (\*1963) studied law at the University of Vienna, worked at the Institute for Legal History, moved to the Austrian Federal Ministry of Science and Research in 1990, became Section Head of the Higher Education Section in 2005, served as its Secretary General from 2009, and has been instrumental in shaping Austrian and European higher education policy, including the implementation of the Universities Act 2002

Friedrich Faulhammer has been Rector of the University for Continuing Education Krems (Danube University Krems) since 2013, appointed for his third term of office until 2025, which has been instrumental in the further development of the University, such as its complete integration into the Austrian University Act, the establishment of PhD studies and the implementation of the Austrian continuing education reform. The University for Continuing Education Krems has a strong international orientation towards Europe, especially towards Central Europe and the Danube region.

In 2016, Friedrich Faulhammer was elected **President of the DRC** for the first time by the General Assembly. Faulhammer used his term of office in 2017 and 2018 to concretise the universities' contribution to the implementation of the **EU Strategy for the Danube Region** by setting up transdisciplinary research and networking projects and to anchor the Danube Rectors' Conference as a stakeholder at the European level.

Friedrich Faulhammer is also committed to this important European region within the Vienna-based **Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM)**. As the new chairman for the next three years, Faulhammer aims to **focus on close cooperation between research and society**. In doing so, IDM and the University for Continuing Education Krems will further deepen their long-standing cooperation.

## 2. Election of new DRC Presidency

After the **DRC General Assembly** on **11 November 2022**, the new DRC Presidency for the period **2023-2024** has been elected.



As of January 1, 2023, Mag. Friedrich Faulhammer, Rector of the University for Continuing Education Krems, began his term of office as the new President of the DRC, with former DRC President Prof. Dr. Zdravko Kačič, Rector of the University of Maribor, and Prof. Dr. Daniel David, Rector of the Babeş-Bolyai

**University**, taking on the role of Vice-Presidents.

## 3. Ivanka Popović elected as Acting Honorary President

The DRC General Assembly on 11 November 2022, resulted in the selection of Ivanka Popović, a previous President and Vice-President, as the DRC's Acting Honorary President. We sincerely appreciate Professor Popović for her invaluable efforts and contributions in her previous roles within the DRC Presidency and anticipate a productive and cooperative relationship in the future!



## 4. Ivanka Popović nominated for the EUA Presidency

We are delighted to announce that Ivanka Popović has been nominated for the position of **EUA President**. The DRC Presidency fully supports her nomination, believing that her election as EUA president would not only amplify the voices of universities from **Central**, **Eastern and Southeastern Europe**, but she would also effectively represent and advocate for the interests of all EUA members.

The upcoming EUA President will be chosen at the **Association's General Assembly** in **April 2023**, held by **Gdańsk University of Technology in Poland**, and will begin their term in July. The Association's Council has put forward three candidates for the position of EUA President for the 2023-2027 period:

**Janet Beer**, Vice-Chancellor (until end 2022), University of Liverpool, United Kingdom;

**Josep Maria Garrell i Guiu**, former Rector, Ramon Llull University, Spain, and EUA Board member; and

Ivanka Popović, former Rector, University of Belgrade, Serbia, and EUA Board member.

The elected candidate will take the role from Professor Michael Murphy, who has been in the position since 2019.

## 6. Call for nominations: Danubius Young Scientist Award 2023



The Austrian Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Research (BMBWF) and the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM) created the **Danubius Award** in 2011, with the intention to honour persons with extraordinary achievements in their scientific activity and output in relation to the Danube Region.

To complement this award with a specific prize for young scientists – the so-called "Danubius Young Scientist Award" competition is now open for nominations!

**14 young scientists** will be granted this award – one for each country that is part of the **EU Strategy for the Danube Region** [Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Romania and Ukraine]\*.

The award seeks to highlight the scientific work and talent of young researchers and enhance the visibility of the scientific community in the region: Moreover, the award encourages young scientists to engage in the scientific examination of the multifaceted issues and questions specifically related to the Danube region.

The award will endow **1,350 Euro for each winner** of the Danubius Young Scientist Award.

An award ceremony is planned for October/November 2023, the details of which will be announced in due time.

Moreover, thanks to the ongoing kind support by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre the JCR will invite the awardees to visit one of their facilities in Ispra, Italy, in 2024.




#### 11. EUA Affiliate Status and EUA Newsletter
